What is the New England Water Infrastructure Network?

The NEEFC has worked with New England communities for over 22 years to build local capacity to pay for the growing cost of protecting critical environmental resources and fostering resilient communities. The New England Water Infrastructure Network (NEWIN) is a new source of **FREE financial**, **managerial**, **and technical support** for the region's municipalities, utilities, and tribes.

Our goal is to help communities access Bipartisan Infrastructure Law funding for drinking water, wastewater, stormwater, and nonpoint source pollution needs through the Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Funds (SRFs) and other sources. NEWIN will prioritize reaching disadvantaged communities, those with pressing water quality challenges, and water systems that have not previously applied for SRF funding.

NEWIN offers customized assistance packages designed to ultimately **bring communities to the point of applying for and securing funding for project implementation**. Some utilities may require only a targeted intervention in one area, while other municipalities will be at the starting line and benefit from substantial assistance through all stages.
